## **Ozaukee County DIC Project**

Dear Neighbor:

ATC is a Wisconsin-based, regulated utility that moves energy along the electric power grid in parts of Wisconsin, Michigan, Minnesota and Illinois. To address proposed load increases in Port Washington and maintain the safe and reliable operation of ATC's system, we are proposing an expansion and upgrade of our transmission system. The project would include parts of Calumet, Fond du Lac, Sheboygan, Ozaukee and Washington counties in east central Wisconsin.

Our records indicate that one of our proposed routes is on or near property you own.

ATC is developing two route options with some common segments shared by both routes. Project overview maps are located on the inside of this mailer. Our development of the routes is still in progress, and adjustments are possible as we gather more information.

You are invited to attend an online or in-person open house that will provide information about the project and an opportunity to ask questions. (See inside of mailer for locations and times.)

## **REGULATORY APPROVAL PROCESS**

Once our route options are finalized, ATC plans to file an application to construct the project with the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSCW). This will likely occur later this year. The PSCW is the regulatory agency with the authority to approve or deny the proposed project and select the final route. State law directs ATC to identify potential power line route options with an emphasis on existing utility and transportation corridors. We are following state statutory guidelines in studying and developing our proposed route options.

After ATC's application is filed and determined to be complete, the PSCW (https://psc.wi.gov) has a process for collecting public comments and receiving testimony during public hearings.

## **WORK WITHIN THE EXISTING EASEMENTS**

Over the coming weeks and months, you may notice crews performing work within the existing ATC easements. Work may include environmental reviews, surveys, soil testing, soil boring and other activities as we gather additional information along the routes.

All contractors working on behalf of ATC carry proper identification. A representative will contact you if there is a need to access your property outside of the existing power line corridors.
